## Building a Safer Community



Welcome to the Bellevue Police Department's new quarterly newsletter! Our goal is to keep you informed about crime trends, prevention tips and what's happening within the department. We're calling the newsletter the Sector Watch because the police department divides the city into three sectors, North, South and West. Each sector has a captain to handle ongoing issues within that area. Below is a brief introduction to your Sector Captain and their contact information. #### Three suspects arrested in three Lakemont burglaries

Bellevue police detectives participated in an extensive multiple-agency investigation that led to three arrests in an organized burglary ring. The group is suspected of dozens of regional burglaries from Bellingham to Kent, including three in the Lakemont neighborhood in Bellevue. The suspects, ages 24, 30 and 31, were arrested without incident in Seattle on June 22, 2023.

This burglary crew is believed to be part of an organized crime group from South America and has been intermittently active in the Puget Sound area for several years. Detectives estimate the group may be responsible for as many as 25 to 30 additional burglaries in Bellevue they are investigating. Residents are urged to stay vigilant about protecting their property.



#### Protect your home while away

Taking a few precautions before you leave town can help ensure your home is safe while you're away.

- Consider installing a home security system with alarms, motion sensors, and surveillance cameras to act as a deterrence. Use timers for lights and electronics to make it look like you are home. Have adequate outdoor lighting.
- Secure all doors and windows.
- Don't advertise your absence by posting on social media that you are away.
- Ask a trusted neighbor to watch over your property and pick up any packages. Sign up for Informed Delivery (<u>usps.com/manage/informed-delivery.htm</u>) to hold mail at the post office.
- Store valuable items, important documents, and spare keys in a secure home safe that is bolted to the ground.
