

Board Update: Landscaping (Gary)

Main Entrance Fountain – 14 years old, several parts needing replacing...clock, float switch, pressure gauge, filter baskets, and a broken part. Added check valves this year to make it easier to start up after a shutdown, especially after Soapings.

Forest Drive Entrance – still expecting to see some additional plants added that were on back order.

NEP – SCA Board recommended Foresthill Park improvements as it is accessible for Somerset, Foresthill, and Forest Drive neighbors...all part of the city area defined as Somerset Neighborhood.


